## NEWS FROM AUSTRALIA

The Australia Government is in the process of developing a National Curriulum. As always, there is concern about how the Earth Sciences will be represented in the curriculum, so some good news below.

### The National Curriculum Board recommends Earth and Environmental Science

Submissions from the Geological Society of Australia and other Earth Science organisations in response to the National Curriculum Board's framing paper for the national science curriculum seem to have had an impact. The fourth Year 11–12 science subject they have recommended is named Earth and Environmental Science and all other areas of the P–10 curriculum appear to have had their Earth Science components retained or expanded.
