

## ART in EARTH SCIENCE

The IESO community recognises the interconnectedness of science and art and the many talents that community members bring to their practice of science.

Each IESO participant is welcome to present (individually) their creative talents through the submission of one, two or three works of art, specifically art that is in some way connected to Earth Science. Each submission must be entirely the work of the individual making the submission and come with a short statement of 200 words or less explaining the work's connection to Earth Science.

Art works can take the form of:

- Art and Graphic design (created by hand or by digital processes)
- Photography (unaltered images, software manipulated images and blended images)
- Poetry and prose in written form
- Sculpture
- Film/Video
- Music/Audio (eg: Song, Instrumental, Spoken word)
- Mixed media (eg: Film of a kinetic sculpture accompanied by poetry or music)

Art works can be submitted to a specially designed Padlet web site where, after moderation, they will be displayed for the entire IESO community to admire. To ensure everyone can submit and admire the materials there are conditions and limits on file types and file sizes:

| Format                 | File type/s              | Maximum file size               | Conditions  |
|------------------------|--------------------------|---------------------------------|---|
| Art and Graphic design | JPG                      | 50 MB - less than<br>10 MB best | Stipulate if it is a photograph of a work or digitally created. Stipulate if AI assisted. |
| Photography            | JPG                      | 50 MB - less than<br>10 MB best | Stipulate if unaltered, processed or enhanced by software (including AI)                  |
| Poetry and prose       | DOC, DOCX,<br>JPG or PDF | 10 MB                           | Less than 500 words, one image with the words allowed but not essential.                  |
| Sculpture and ceramics | JPG, MP4,<br>M4V         | 50 MB                           | 3D objects shown by several images in one <u>or</u> a video of less than 5 minutes.       |
| Film/Video             | MP4, M4V                 | 100 MB                          | Less than 5 minutes   |
| Music/Audio            | MP3, MP4,<br>M4V, WAV    | 100 MB                          | Less than 5 minutes   |
| Mixed media            | JPG, MP4                 | 100 MB                          | Less than 5 minutes for videos.   |

## Submission rules

- English is the official language of the IESO. All written and spoken words must be in English.
- File types not listed above will be rejected. Advice on file conversions will be provided if required.
- Files that exceed the size and/or time limit will be rejected. Advice on file size reduction will be provided if required.
- Files submitted without an IESO registration code in the title will be rejected.
- Artworks and associated artist's comments will be subject to moderation. Pornographic, insulting, racist and sexist material will be rejected.
- Rejected materials can be resubmitted if modified appropriately to address the reason for rejection.

## Submission procedure

- Make sure you are registered for the IESO and you know your IESO registration code.
- Open the Padlet website at this address: <https://tinyurl.com/mr3rkk2p>
- Password is STEAM2023
- Select a category for your submission and click the + below the category title to add your submission.
- In the pop-up window:
  - Write the title of your work and your individual IESO registration code → **Title** by **ABC000**
  - Drag and drop your file into the pop-up  
(or click the upload file icon and follow the prompts).
  - Write 200 words or less explaining your work's connection to Earth Science.
  - Click submit → an email will be sent to the moderator.
  - Email [greg.mcnamara@asi.edu.au](mailto:greg.mcnamara@asi.edu.au) confirming your submission and IESO registration code.
- When approved your work will be fully visible to the community.

**All art works must be submitted to the web site before August 15, 2023.**

All entries (arranged according to format) will be published on the special website by 17 August 2023 to enable everyone to admire them and vote on them. Voting details are provided separately.

Entries will be judged as Excellent / Very Good / Good by an international jury as well as by IESO peers.

These will be respectively 10%, 20% and 30% of the total number of IESO entries.
